David Rowlands Community Field

The Council will seek ways to encourage other activities to take place on the Field. No redesign of the Field will take place without a full public consultation taking place.

Local Facilities

The Council will continue to keep the Abertridwr toilets open on a yearly basis.

Transport, Highways and Refuse

The Council will continue to work with PCC to ensure a weekly bus service is maintained for residents.

The Council will continue to work with PCC to keep a regular rubbish collection in the community.

The Council will continue to work with PCC to investigate a way of incorporating a safety mirror for traffic emerging from the Dam as per resident's requests and support in the 2014 survey.

Abertridwr and surrounding areas

The Council will continue to maintain and upkeep the Abertridwr playground.

Top Village

The Council will work in support of local residents and businesses where requested to resolve disputes relating to the condition of the roads, facilities and services to the top village.

Tourism

The Council will continue to work with partner agencies to improve the visitor experience including but not limited to appearance, facilities and car parking. This will encourage the use of the probation service to provide manpower to tidy and clean up all areas of the community.

Education

The Council will continue to support and call for FREE educational transport services from the village to all catchment schools.

Others

The Council will continue to work with Dyfed Powys Police on crime prevention as well as discussing ways to make the current patrols more visible.

The Council will continue to support the Village Hall Committee.
